HERONS & KINGFISHERS



ISSUE - EATING FISH OUT OF A POND

 Provide lots of places for fish to hide (e.g. water lilies, cinder blocks, ceramic drain tile, wire baskets, or sections of PVC pipes sunk to the bottom of the pond).

Herons usually land in an open area a short distance from the edge of the pond, then walk over to the fish. Some ways you can make this more difficult is to:

- Create a fencing or vegetation perimeter barrier around the pond.
- Make the pond sides steep and keep the water level 8 to 12 inches below the edge of the pond. This makes it harder for predators to reach the fish.
- Ensure the pond is at least 3 feet deep at all points. This will make it more difficult for a heron to fish effectively.

Kingfishers sit on a perch or hover above ponds to spot fish.

• Install a net cover, tightly stretched; as birds can easily become tangled in loose netting.
